Singles Events	<p>Boys Singles U12, U14, U16, U18 and Girls Singles U12, U14, U16, U18:</p> <p>Draw Size: Maximum 24 players per event Format: Best of 3 Tiebreak Sets with a 10-point match tiebreak in lieu of the third set</p> <p>Singles Consolation: All players losing their first match will be offered 1 consolation match (draws may not be played to completion) Format: Pro-set to 8 games with no-ad scoring and a 7-point tiebreak played at 7-7</p>



Doubles Events	<p>Girls Doubles U12, U14, U16, U18 and Boys Doubles U12, U14, U16, U18:</p> <p>Eligibility: Players must be playing singles to be eligible to play doubles</p> <p>Format: Pro-set to 8 games with no-ad scoring and a 7-point tiebreak played at 7-7</p> <p>Doubles Consolation: may be offered depending on court availability</p>
Practice Courts	Practice Courts available Thursday June 11, details TBD
Grading	<p>National Junior Open Series, ranking points equivalent to a 4-star tournament or a quarterfinal finish at a national championship, whichever is higher</p> <p>Ranking points will be awarded for both singles and doubles</p>
Entry fee	<p>\$70 for singles, \$30 for doubles</p> <p>Players may register for a maximum of 1 singles event and 1 doubles event</p>
Acceptance Criteria	<p>Acceptance will be based on the latest National Bank Ranking:</p> <p>16 Direct Entries</p> <p>8 Wildcards</p>
Wildcards	<p>Wildcards will be awarded as follows:</p> <p>Manitoba Players (in order of ranking)</p> <p>Saskatchewan Players (in order of ranking)</p> <p>All Other Players (in order of ranking)</p>
Schedule of Play	8:00 am – 10:00 pm all three days, players must be available to play at all scheduled times

Regulations	<p>All matches will be governed by the Tennis Canada Rules of the Court. Players are expected to abide by the Code of Conduct as set out by Tennis Canada.</p> <p>Players are expected to be dressed and ready to play 15 minutes prior to their scheduled match time.</p> <p>Lateness penalties including default after 15 minutes, will be enforced.</p> <p>Players without acceptable attire will not be permitted to play. Non-marking shoes must be worn while on court.</p> <p>Late Withdrawal and Failure to Complete Required Tournament Events (LW/FC) penalties will be enforced.</p>



	<p>Players are expected to know and understand the Tennis Canada Rules of the Court and the Code of Conduct.</p> <p>Players or any persons associated with a player (i.e. parents, coaches, friends or family) are expected to give due respect to the host clubs, their members, officials, other players and any other person associated with the tournament.</p> <p>Misconduct, whether on or off the court, will result in penalties against the player and any Player Support Team Member (coach, trainer, manager, agent, medical or para-medical personnel and/or family member, tournament guest, or other similar associate) of a player.</p> <p>Tennis MB has a no-tolerance policy towards abusive or inappropriate behaviour.</p> <p>Tennis MB has the final decisions on all matters.</p>
